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Part 1<br>Numbering of Buildings

§101. Property Owners to Number Dwelling Houses. From and after the passage of this Part 1 it shall be the duty of all owners of lots or real estate fronting on the streets or alleys of this Borough to have the dwelling house thereon numbered as hereinafter directed. (Ord. 99, 7/15/1908, §1)
§102. Numbering System. In numbering the dwelling houses on the streets running north and south, the beginning of said numbering shall be made at the southern and northern building lines of Coplay Street, and all the dwellings shall be numbered south of Coplay Street and upwards:

South of Centre Street, one hundred and upward;
South of Schrieber Avenue, two hundred and upward;
North of Coplay Street, one hundred and upward;
North of Chestnut Street, one hundred and upward;
North of Oak Street, two hundred and upward;
North of Whitehall Street, three hundred and upwards;
On streets extending east and west, the numbering shall be as follows:
Between the Lehigh River and Front Street, one and upwards;
Between Front and Second Streets, one hundred and upwards;
Between Second and Third Streets, two hundred and upwards;
Between Third and Fourth Streets, three hundred and upwards;
Between Fourth and Fifth Streets, four hundred and upwards;
Between Fifth and Sixth Streets, five hundred and upwards;
Between Sixth and Seventh Streets, six hundred and upwards;
Between Seventh and Eighth Streets, seven hundred and upwards;
Between Eighth and Ninth Streets, eight hundred and upwards;
Between Ninth and Tenth Streets, nine hundred and upwards;
Between Tenth and Eleventh Streets, ten hundred and upwards; Between Eleventh and Twelfth Streets, eleven hundred and upwards;
Between Twelfth and Thirteenth Streets, twelve hundred and upwards;
Between Thirteenth and the Borough line, thirteen hundred and upwards;
On all streets running north and south the odd numbers shall be on the east side and the even numbers on the west side of said streets; and the streets running east and west the odd numbers shall be on the south side and the even numbers on the north side of the said streets. Provided, for that portion of the Borough south of Chestnut Street and west of Ninth Street, and for any other portion where streets and alleys do not run generally paralle1, a different numbering system may be developed by the Borough Engineer, that the Engineer considers will provide the most logical means of locating the properties, and individual numbers, conforming to such system, shall be assigned to each dwelling house by the Engineer.

§103. Placement of Numbers. The numbers required by this Part 1 shall be placed in a conspicuous place on the front of the main building on each lot so as to be clearly visible from the street. (Ord. 99, 7/15/1908, §3; as amended by Ord. 393, 6/11/1963, §2)
§104. Assignment and Frequency of Numbers. Numbers shall be assigned by the Borough Engineer for each dwelling house in the Borough not heretofore correctly numbered, with each number representing such frontage as the Engineer may determine, but in no case may numbers be assigned on the basis of a frontage of less than twenty ( $20^{\prime}$ ) feet. Any property owner may apply to the Borough Engineer for the correct number assigned to his house, and the Engineer shall furnish any property owner so requesting with such number without charge or fee. §105. Time Limit for Numbering Buildings. Whenever the Borough shall notify any property owner of the correct number for his house, such property owner shall number his house properly, as hereby required, within sixty (60) days after such notice.
